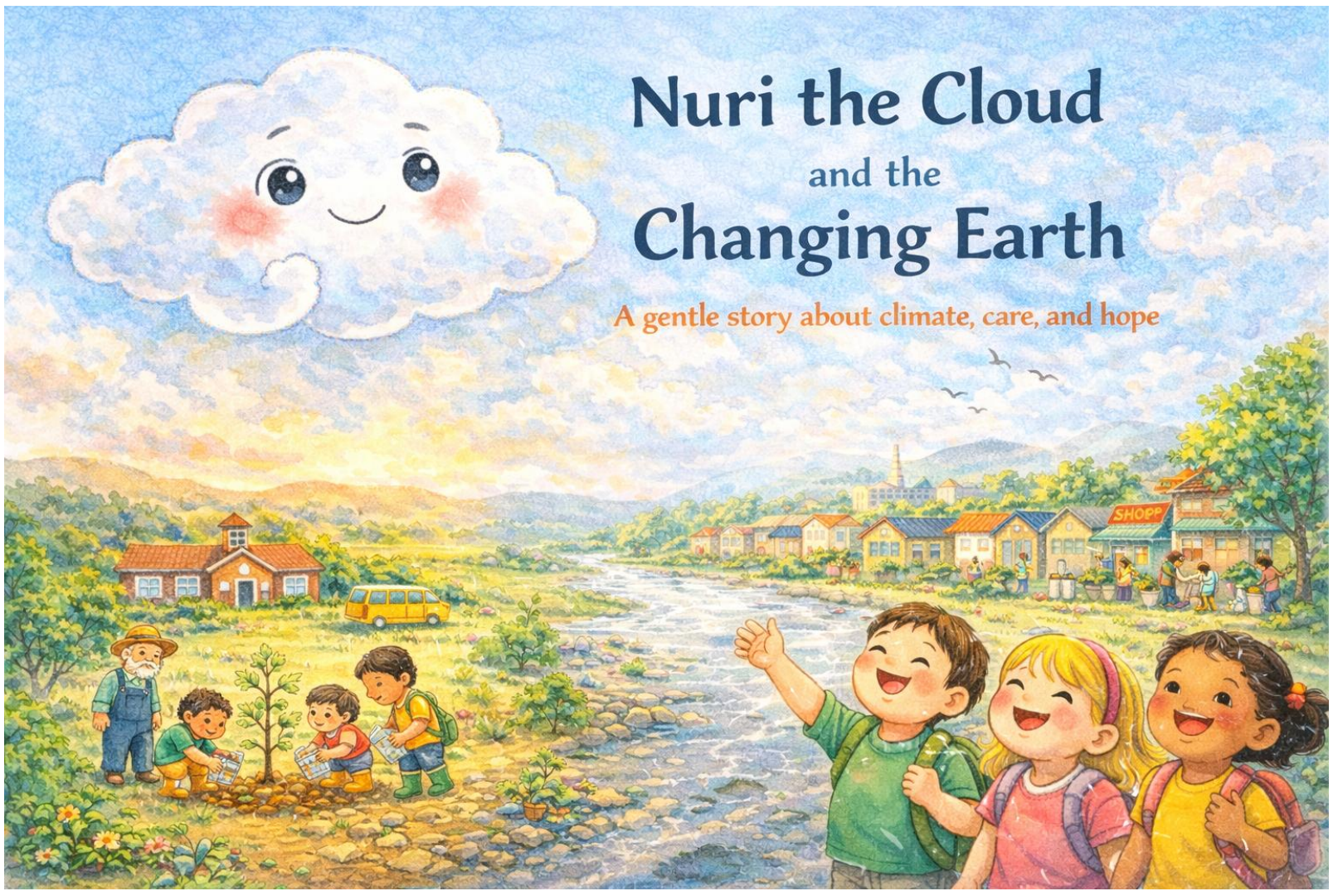

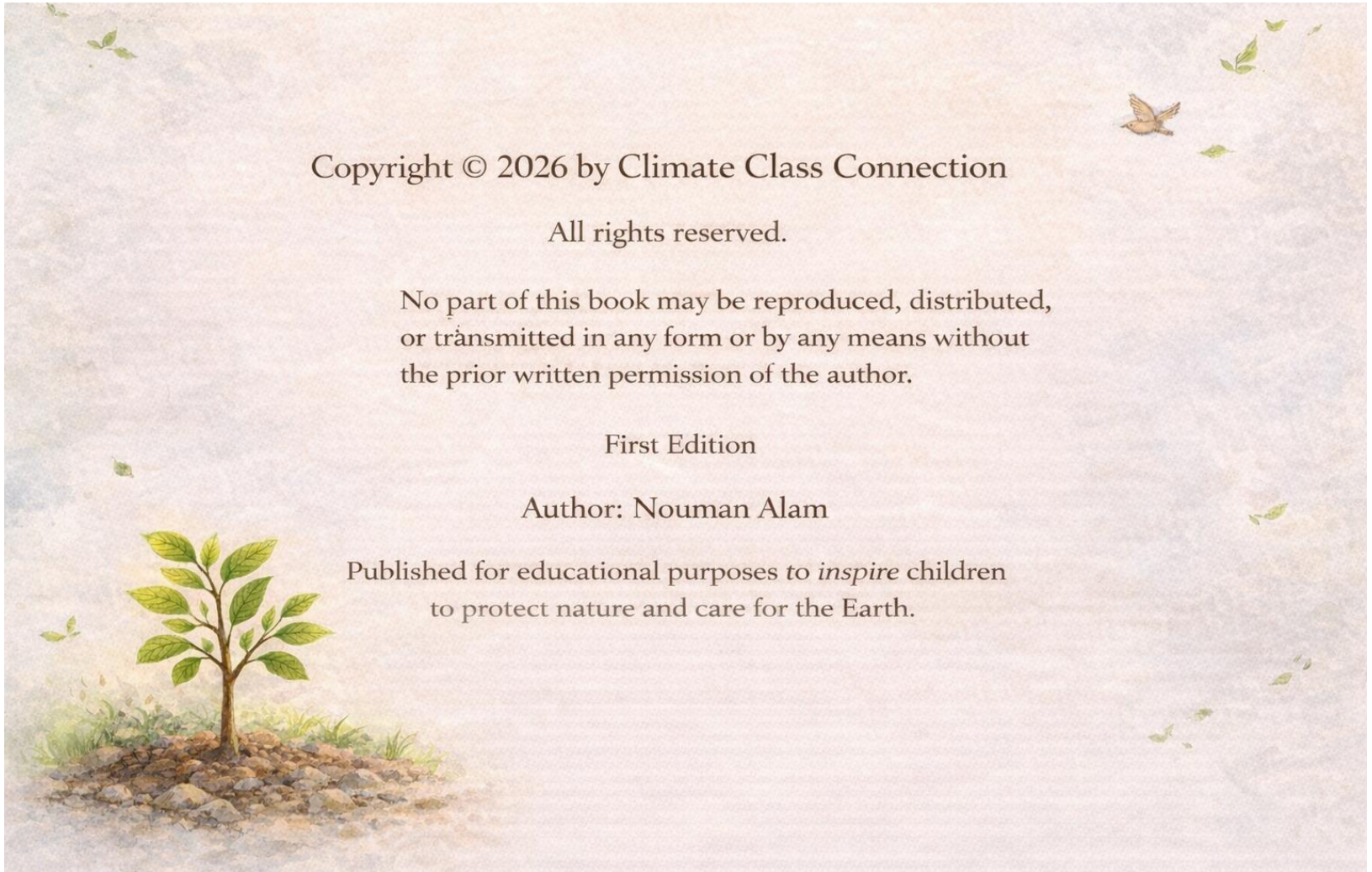

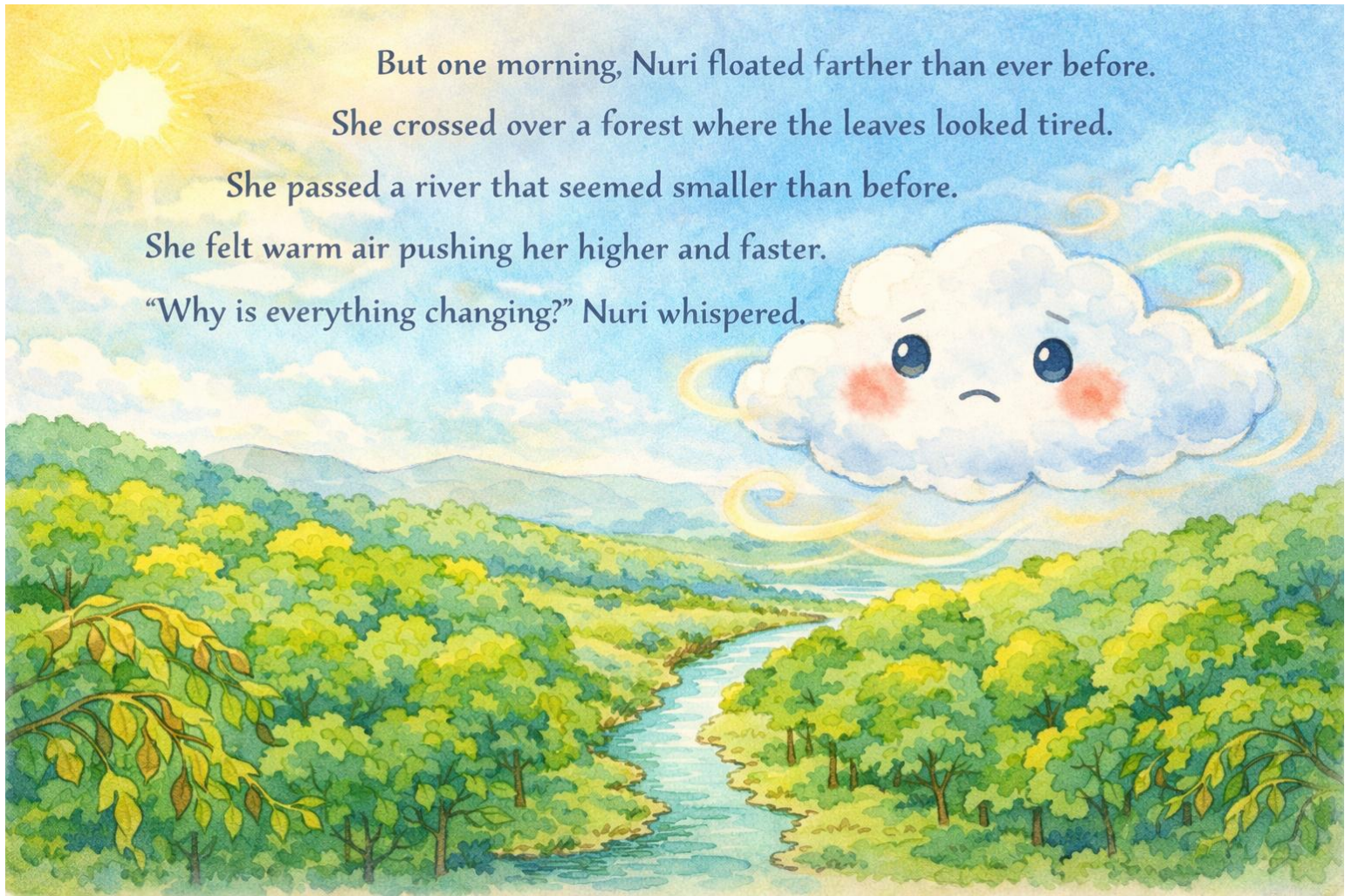

Soon Nuri reached a schoolyard.

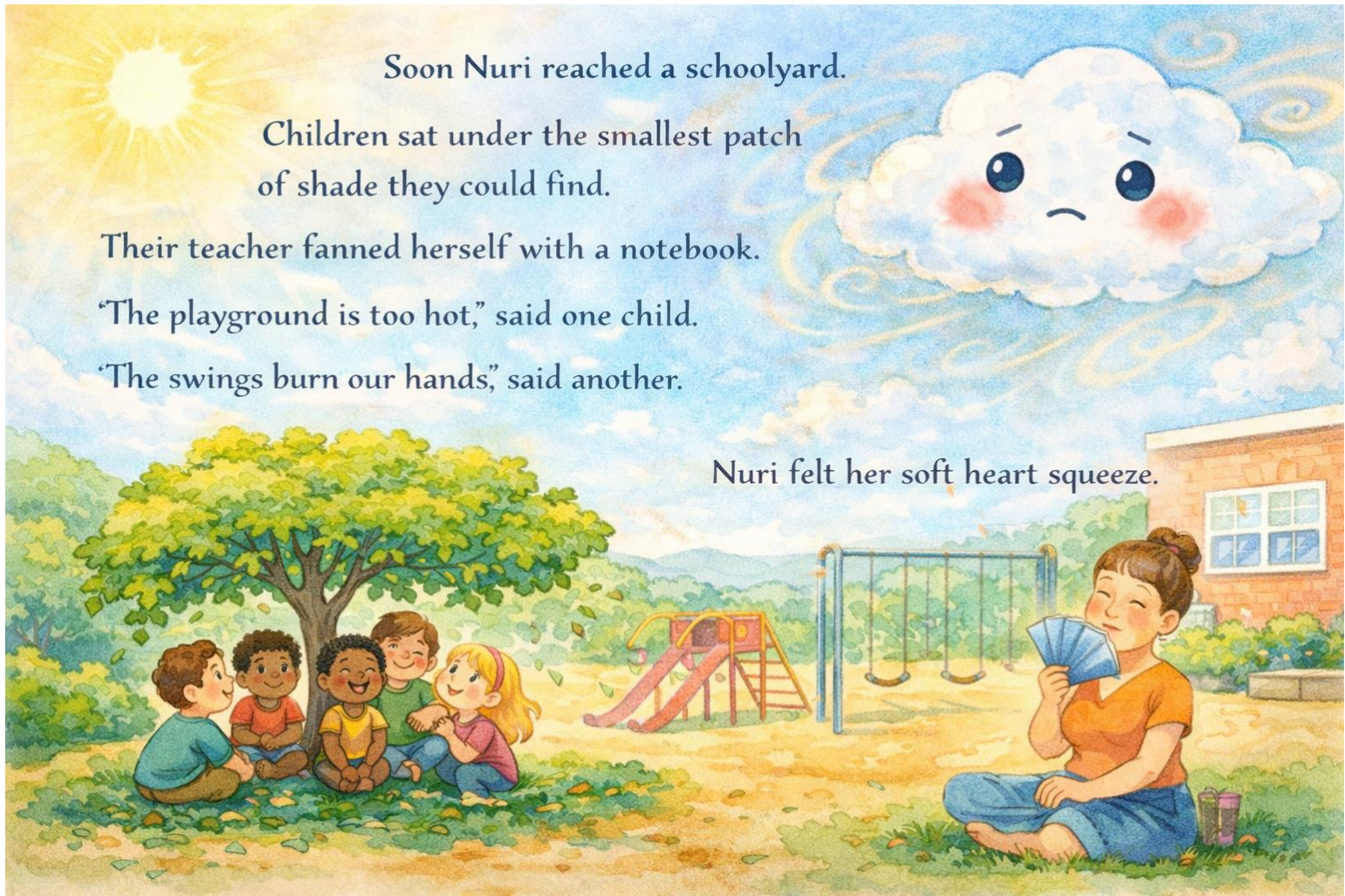
Children sat under the smallest patch

She floated on.

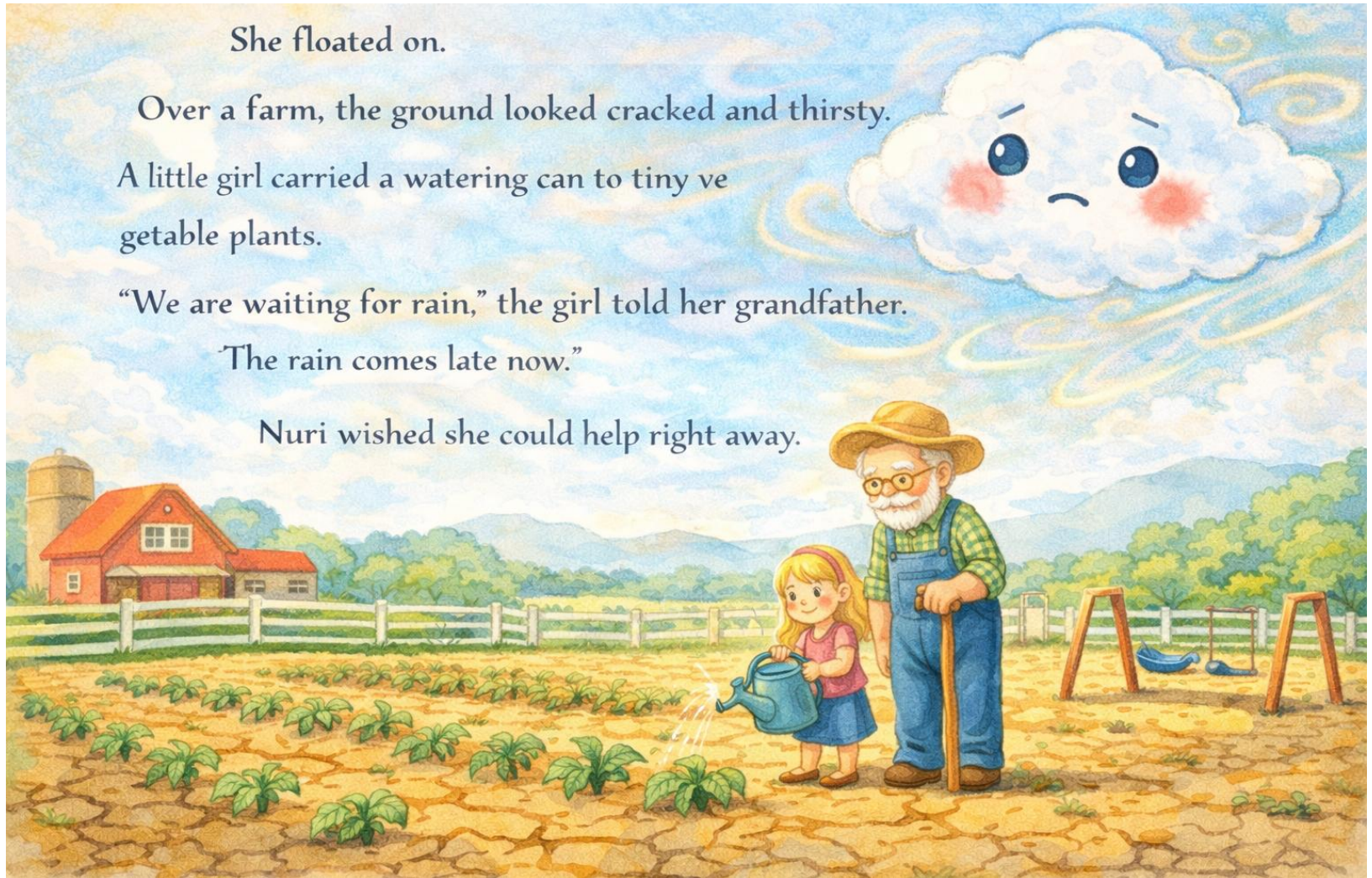
Over a farm, the ground looked cracked and thirsty.

Cars crowded the roads.

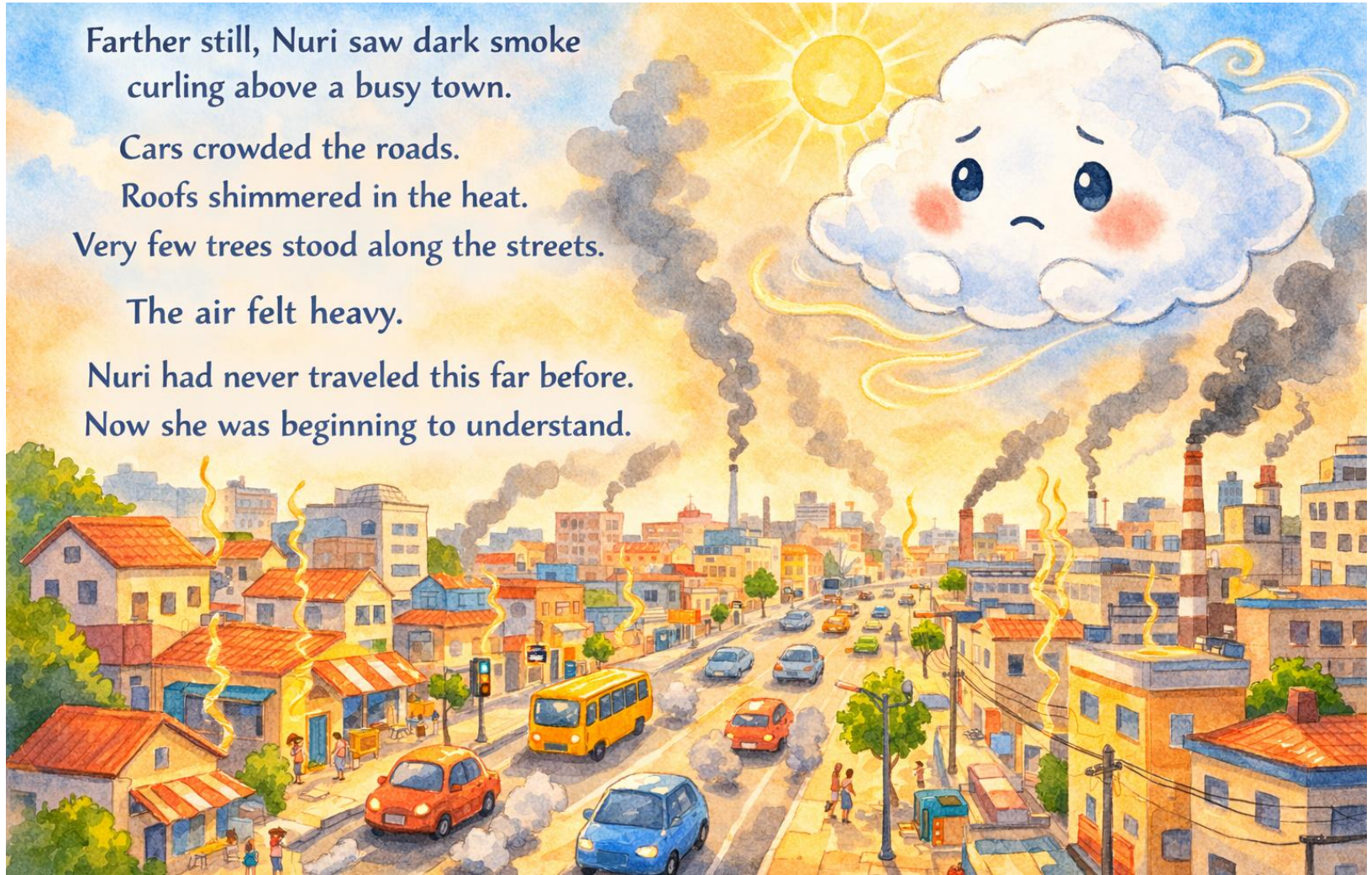
Roofs shimmered in the heat.

Mud covered the ground.

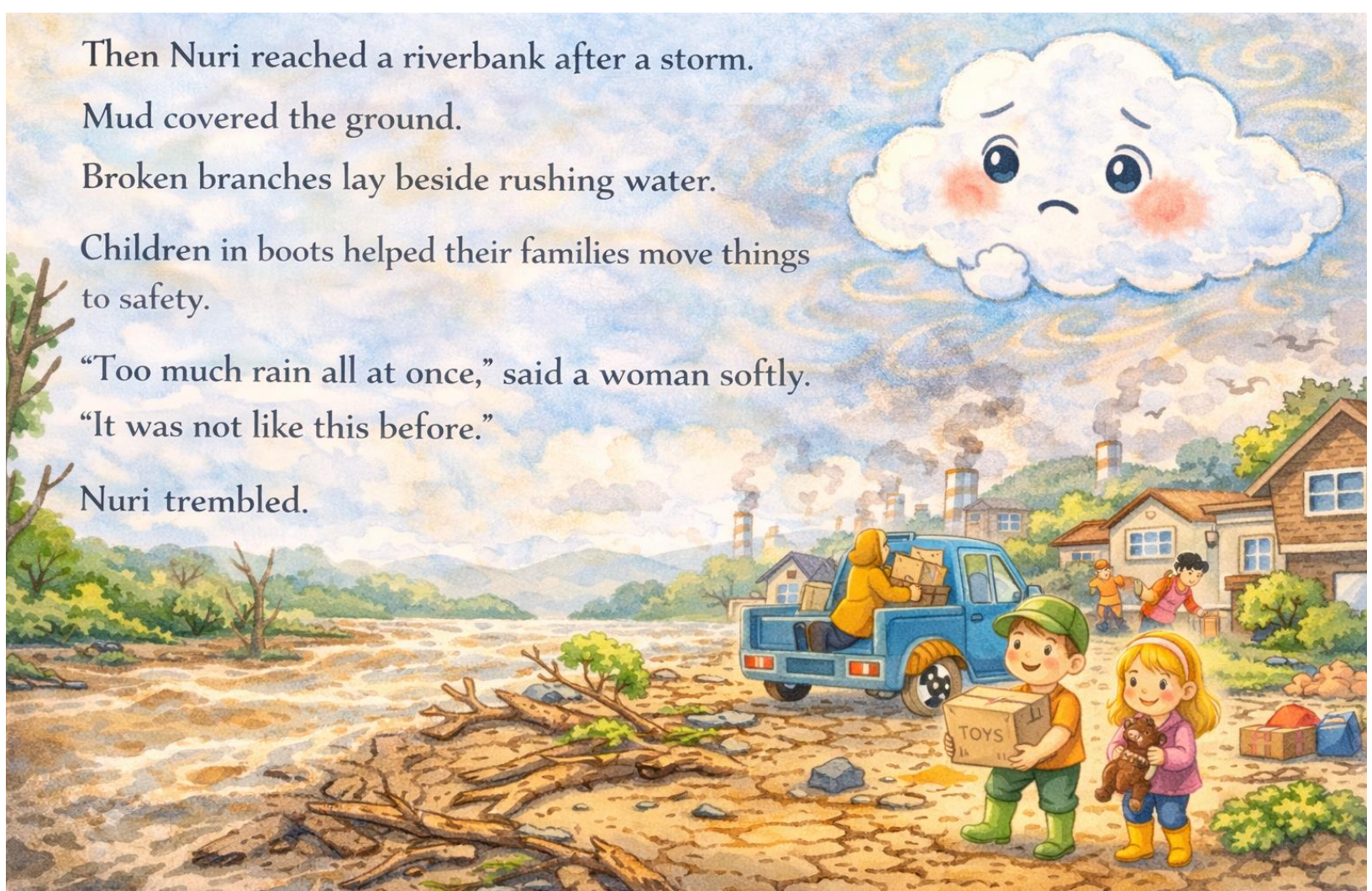
Broken branches lay beside rushing water.

Children in boots helped their families move things to safety.

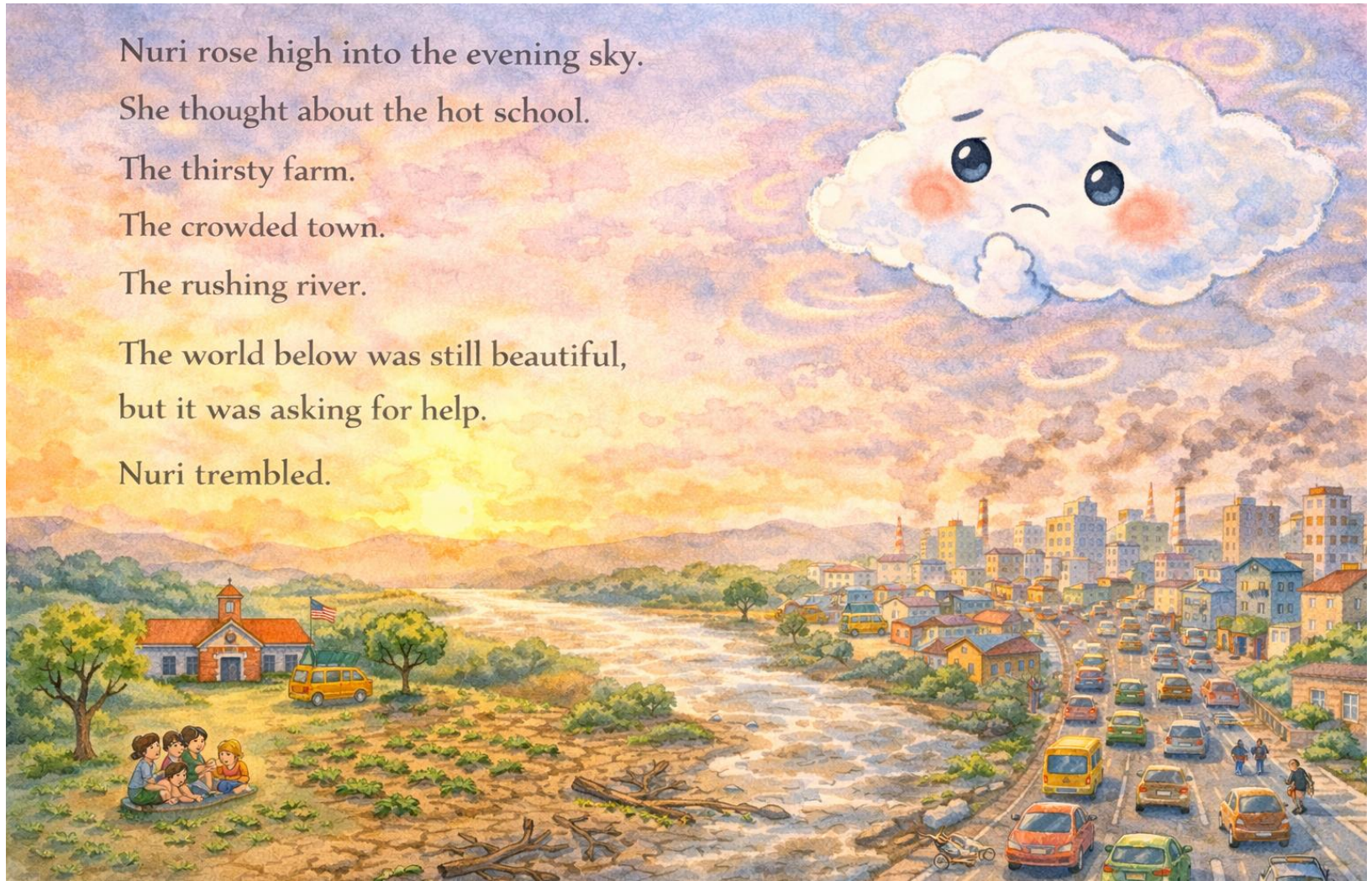
“Too much rain all at once,” said a woman softly.

This time, she looked more closely.

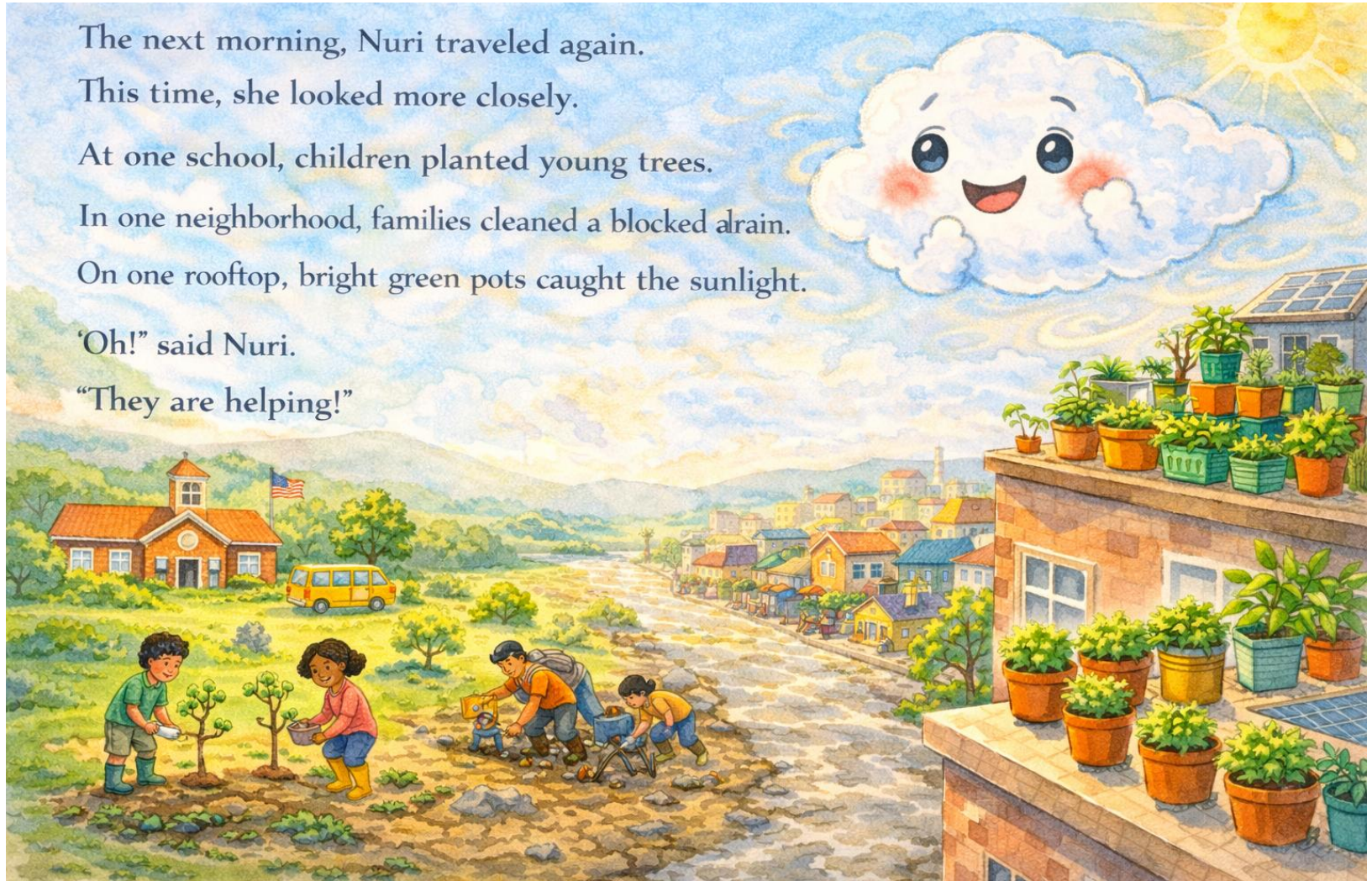
At one school, children planted young trees.

“They are helping!”



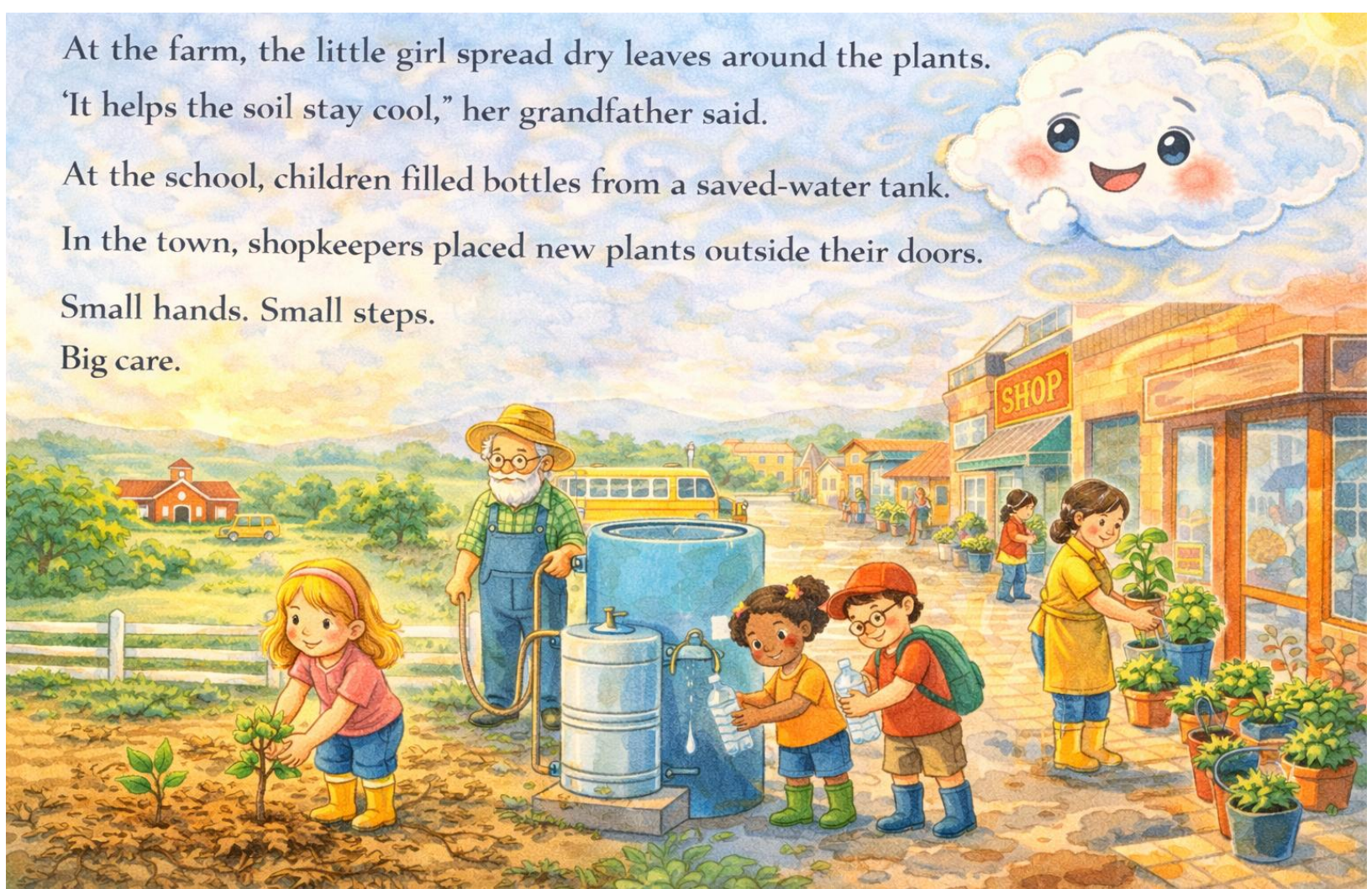
At the farm, the little girl spread dry leaves around the plants.

Nuri drifted lower and lower.

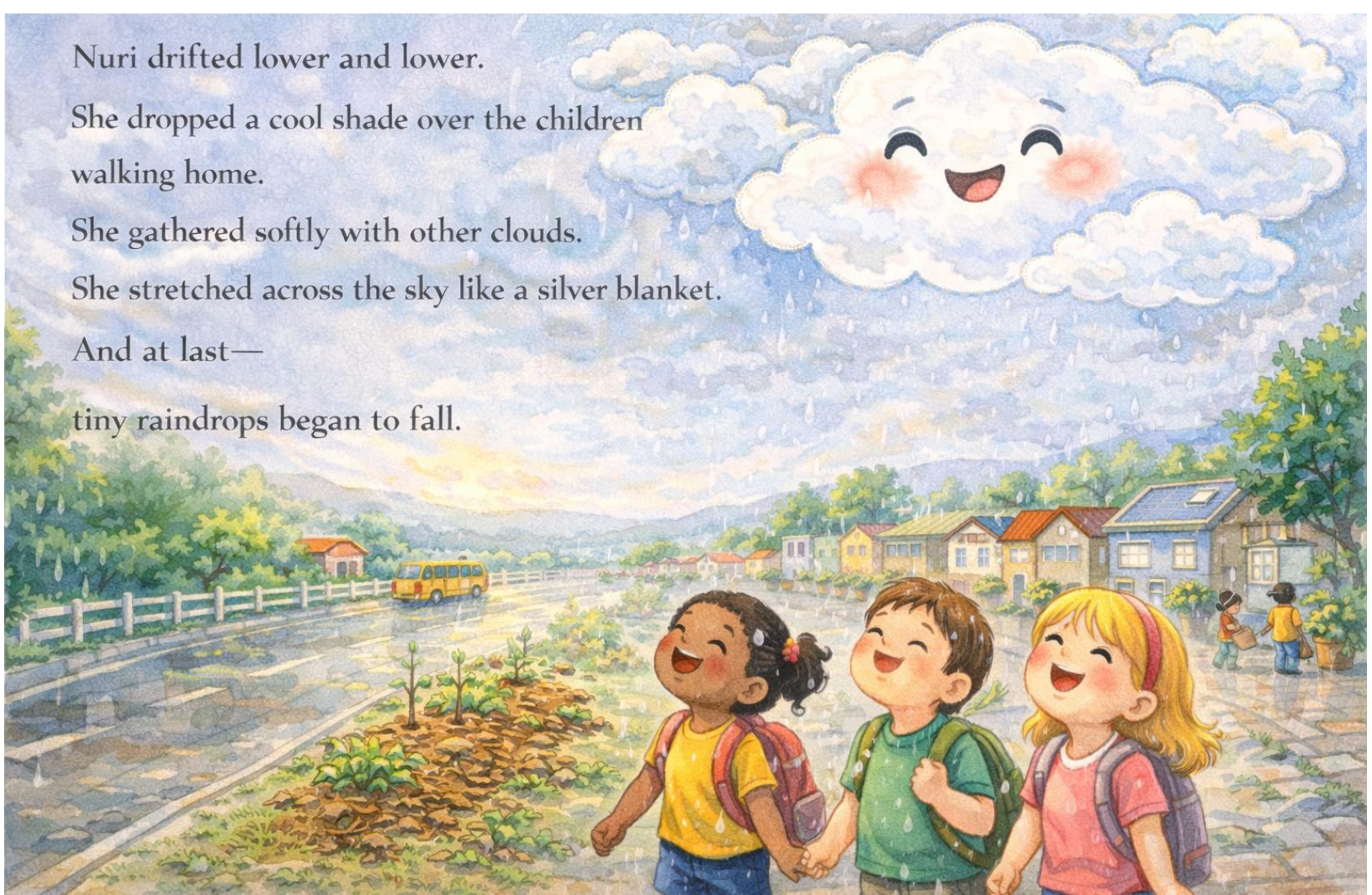
She dropped a cool shade over the children

The river slowed to a gentle song.

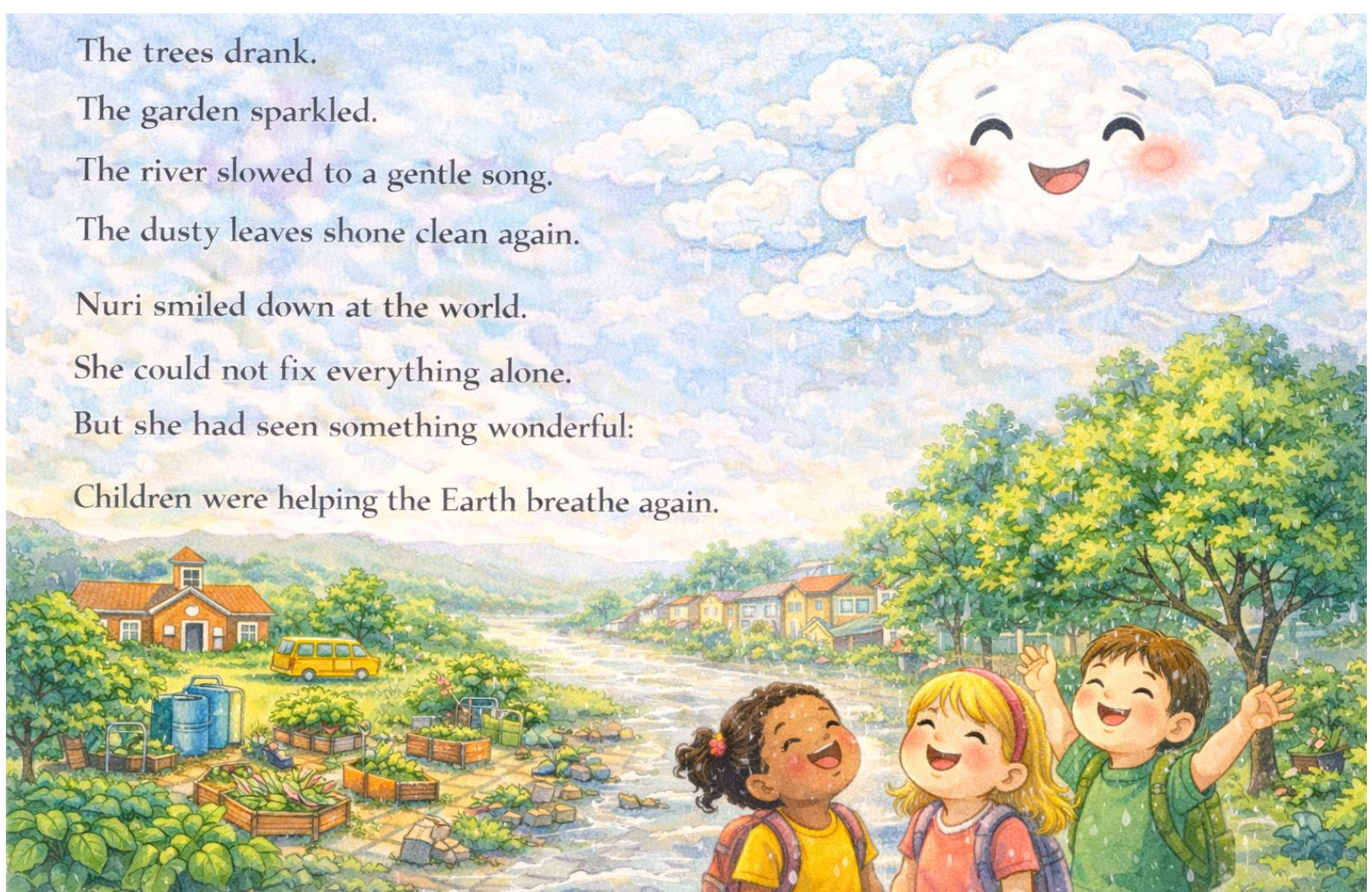
The dusty leaves shone clean again.

Nuri smiled down at the world.

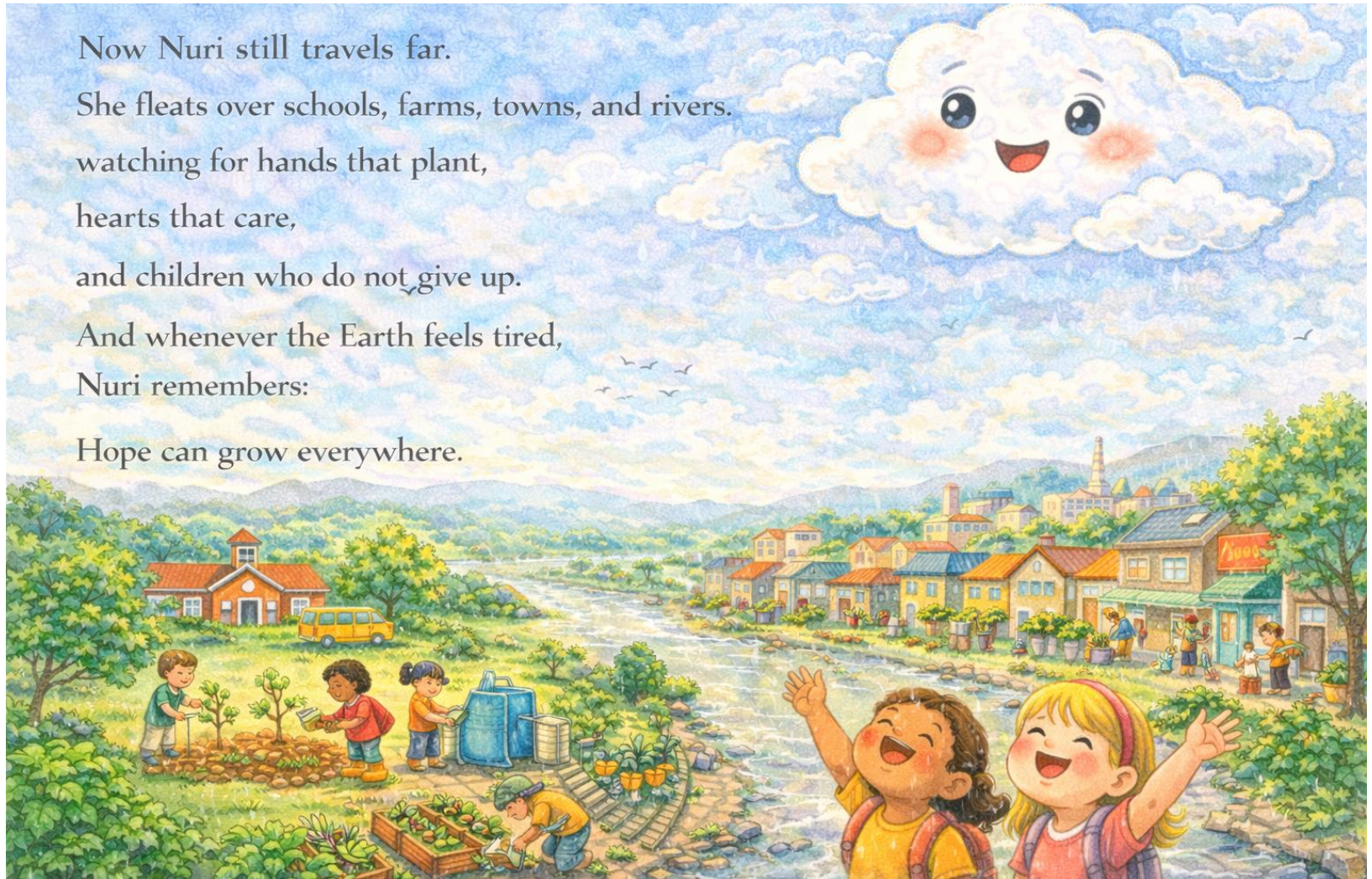
She could not fix everything alone.
