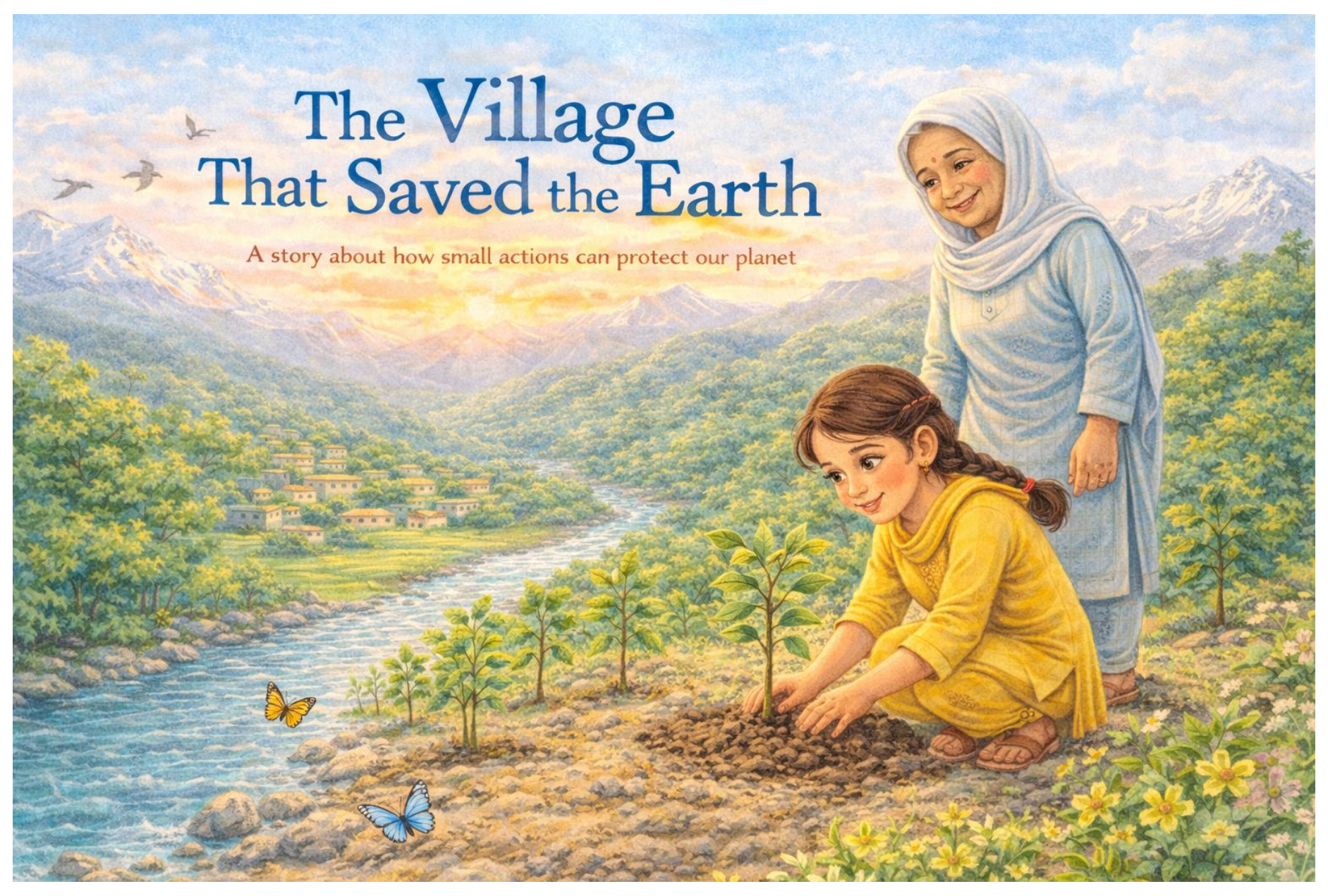

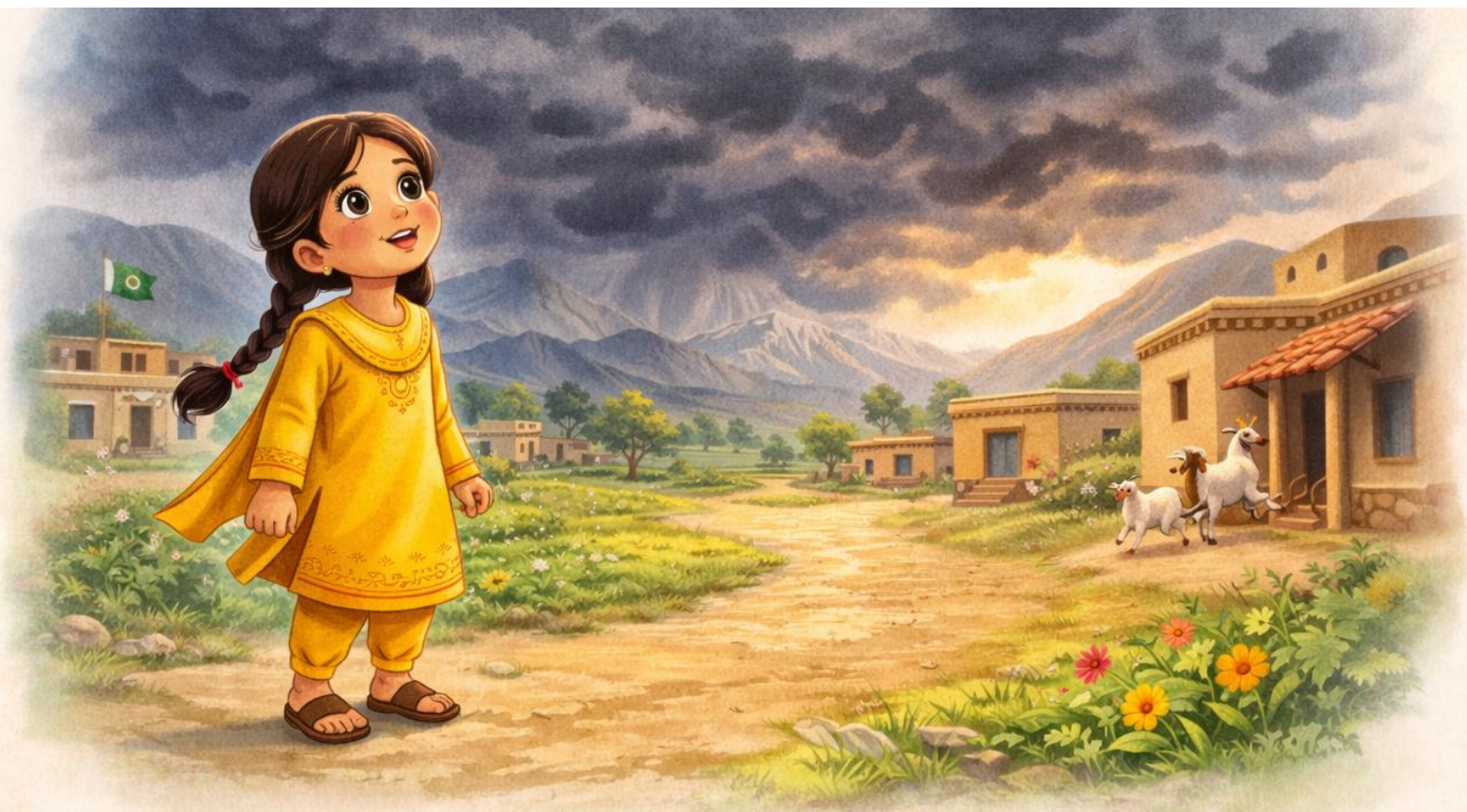
Amina is an eight-year-old girl who lives in a beautiful village in Pakistan.

Their strong roots hold the dirt and drink the extra rainwater.”



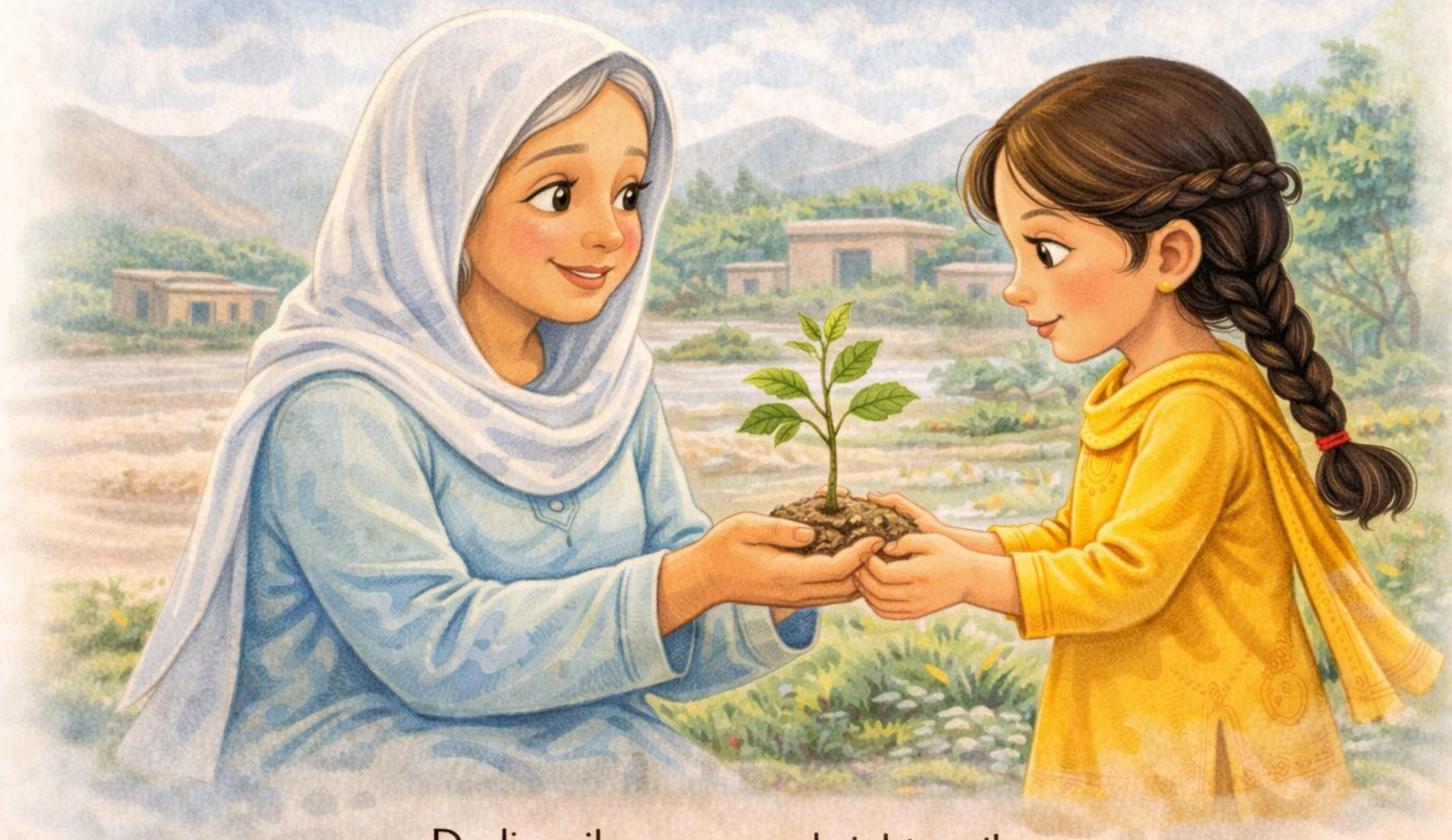
“Without trees, the water runs too fast and brings a flood.”

- Can you plant a tree or help take care of plants near your home or school?

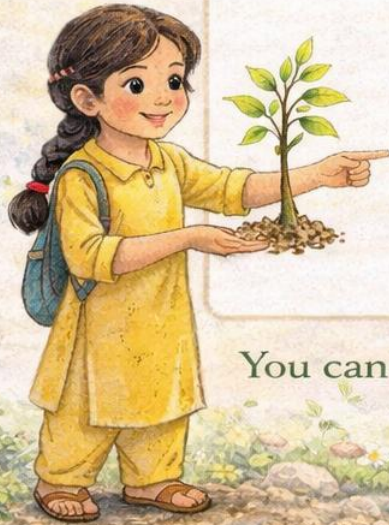
Talking about stories helps children understand how they can protect nature and care for our planet.
